Dear Parents/Carers

As we approach half-term I would like to remind all parents and carers of the details of our uniform policy. This enables you to ensure that all purchases in the summer are correct for your child. The majority of students are very smart and wear our uniform correctly. However, I would like to clarify a few issues regarding our uniform.

- Students are expected to wear the school blazer to school and around school at all times (unless given permission by teachers to remove).
- An optional navy school jumper can be worn in addition to the blazer but not instead.
- Girls' skirts should be an appropriate length for school and should be around knee length. Currently too many girls' skirts are too short and inappropriate for school.
- Girls must also ensure they wear a pin badge that represents their house.
- From September following discussions with The Student Council, girls will be given the option of wearing a house tie and collar.
- School shoes must be worn by all students, these should be traditional school style, not trainers or canvas pumps or the converse leather shoes which are currently worn by some students.
- Students must ensure they are properly equipped with a pencil case and equipment each day, including a scientific calculator and their planner.
- Trainers for PE lessons should not be completely black.

All students in years 7-10 will have their current uniform checked during Guidance Time by the Leadership Team during the first week back.
